#### **Plastic Pollution**





#### **Extent of the Problem**

- **60-80**% of all marine debris is plastic, and 90% of floating marine debris is plastic
- 6x the amount of plastic than plankton (up to 36:1)
- Plastic film the largest identifiable type of debris (1/4 of total)
- 35% of fish sampled had ingested plastic








#### **Economic Impacts**

#### Santa Monica Bay Trash TMDL

"If within three (3) years of Regional Board adoption date of this TMDL, a city or county voluntarily adopts local ordinances to ban plastic bags, smoking in public places and single use expanded polystyrene food packaging, it shall receive a three year extension of the final compliance date."

- Unique Coalition of Support
  - CGA, NGOs, local gov't, UFCW, Governor
- Passes Assembly 42-27
- Media momentum (i.e. LA Times Editorials)
- ACC pours \$\$\$ into ads and donations
- Dies in Senate 14-21 (despite leadership support)
