 Senate Bill 1383 Regulations

 In September 2016, Governor Edmund Brown Jr. set methane emissions reduction targets for california (Senate Bill (SB) 1383 Lara, Chapter 395, Statutes of 2016) in a statewide effort to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants. The targets must:

 Brochest Competitive Reference

 Reduce organic waste disposal 50% by 2020 and 75% by 2025.

 Rescue for people to eat at least 20% of currently disposed surplus food by 2025.

 These are statewide goals that California must collectively achieve, and not individual requirements. In other words, individual jurisdictions and individual food donors are not required to meet the organic was disposal goals and 20 percent food recovery rate separately.
