SENATE BILL 970 – INTRODUCED FEBRUARY 8, 2016 - SUPPORT IF AMENDED ORGANIC FOOD WASTE DIVERSION

The Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee/Integrated Waste Management Task Force (Task Force) is pleased to **support** Senate Bill 970 (SB 970), **if amended**. In its current form, SB 970 would require the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), in consultation with the State Air Resources Board (ARB) and the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission, to develop a pilot program that encourages cost-effective and efficient integrated organic food waste diversion projects by June 1, 2017.

Pursuant to Chapter 3.67 of the Los Angeles County Code and the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (Assembly Bill 939 [AB 939], as amended), the Task Force is responsible for coordinating the development of all major solid waste planning documents prepared for the County of Los Angeles and the 88 cities in Los Angeles County with a combined population in excess of ten million. Consistent with these responsibilities and to ensure a coordinated, cost-effective, and environmentally sound solid waste management system in Los Angeles County, the Task Force also addresses issues impacting the system on a countywide basis. The Task Force membership includes representatives of the League of California Cities-Los Angeles County Division, County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors, City of Los Angeles, waste management industry, environmental groups, the public, and a number of other governmental agencies.

SB 970's objective of organic waste diversion aligns with multiple previously chaptered State laws pertaining to waste diversion mandates and/or statewide policy goals, including AB 32 (2006, Nunez), AB 341 (2011, Chesbro), and AB 1826 (2014, Chesbro). SB 970 may provide local jurisdictions with the additional resources necessary for efficient organic waste diversion projects on a regional scale.

However, while the Task Force is highly encouraged to see legislation such as SB 970, the Task Force respectfully recommends the following amendments:

- Section 2, Subdivision (f) pursuant to AB 1826, insert "as defined in Subdivision 42649.8 (c)" between organic waste and constitutes more than......
- The source of the funding for the program should be identified in this bill and should not impact or take-away from the currently proposed Fiscal Year 2016-17 greenhouse gas reduction funds to CalRecycle.
- Revise the specified scale of the funded project/program from a pilot to a commercial scale operation.
- New Section 42649.88, first sentence, insert "while protects public health and safety and the environment, it also" between...." Commission, shall develop a pilot program that"" encourages cost-effective and...."

Upon inclusion of these amendments, the Task Force believes SB 970 stands to improve the State's broader organics diversion goals with greater potential impact and reach, particularly as organics remain among the principal catalysts of methane emissions, one of the most potent and toxic gases among all greenhouse gases.
