CalRecycle's Jurisdiction Review Process



Throughout the four year review cycle, CalRecycle considers various factors when evaluating a jurisdiction's "good faith effort" to comply with implementation of SRRE, HHWE, MCR programs, and AB 939 diversion requirements.

Key factors include, but are not limited to:

Achievement of the 50 percent equivalent per capita disposal requirement.
The number of businesses in compliance.
The recovery rate of the recyclables/organic waste from the material recovery facilities that are
utilized by the businesses.
The extent to which the jurisdiction is educating and monitoring businesses and notifying those
businesses that are not in compliance.
The availability of markets for collected recyclables/ organic materials and access to processing
facilities.

CalRecycle's Jurisdiction Review Process



- ☐ CalRecycle may initiate a formal public review before the end of a four-year review cycle.
- ☐ If a jurisdiction has significant gaps in implementing SRRE and/or MCR programs, CalRecycle's Local Assistance and Market Development (LAMD) staff may send a formal Letter of Concern (Letter) and give the jurisdiction 30 days to respond upon receipt of the Letter.
- ☐ If the jurisdiction does not respond or the jurisdiction's response does not adequately address CalRecycle's concern, LAMD may present findings at a CalRecycle monthly public meeting and seek approval to refer the jurisdiction to the Jurisdiction Compliance Unit (JCU).



2012 -2015 Jurisdiction Review cycle



- At CalRecycle's March 2017 public meeting, LAMD reported that 36 jurisdictions had significant SRRE and/ or MCR program gaps identified during the 2012-15 Jurisdiction Review Cycle.
- Prior to that meeting, LAMD provided all 36 jurisdictions with 30 days to demonstrate how they would address identified gaps.
 - ❖ 10 Jurisdictions did not adequately respond to the 30 day request and were immediately referred to the JCU.
 - 26 jurisdictions provided plans and LAMD continued to work with them for an additional 12 months.
- At CalRecycle's March 20, 2018 public meeting, 6 of these 26 jurisdictions were referred to the JCU for not adequately implementing their plans.

LAMD staff's 2012-2015 review determined that 36 Cities had gaps in SRRE programs and MCR law implementation




