




What is the Bicycle Master Plan (BMP)?



- Establishes a vision for the future of biking in the County
- Updates the 2012 Bike Master Plan
- Serves as a guide for the development
 of safe and accessible bikeways and
 paths within unincorporated Los Angeles
 County and along County flood control
 district channels



What will the Bike Master Plan Accomplish?



- Draws a bicycle network on the map:
 - Identifies streets where improved bike infrastructure will have the most impact
- Supports implementation of recommended bike infrastructure:
 - Helps prioritize improved bike infrastructure during routine efforts like resurfacing
 - Supports applications for dedicated funding
- Recommends bike programs and policies



Project Goals



Vision: Make bicycling safe, convenient, and accessible for all ages and abilities in Los Angeles County



Goal #1: Equity

Invest in underserved, pollution burdened communities that are most dependent on active transportation.



Goal #3: Mobility

Increase the number of biking and multimodal trips.



Goal #2: Safety

Prioritize bicycle projects that improve the safety of our streets.



Goal #4: Accountability

Be responsive, transparent, and accountable to our communities and regional partners.

- Interest in safe places for youth and families to ride







How Was the Draft Network Developed?





Key Principles:

- 1. Safety The frequency and severity of crashes are minimized and conflicts with motor vehicles are minimized.
- 2. Connectivity Each community is connected to key destinations including retail areas, local schools, employment areas, major transit stops, and existing and planned trails.


